


MEDARE: The need...

Long and rich history in monitoring the atmosphere, going back in time several centuries in some countries and at least to the mid-19th century across much of the GMR

However, limited availability and accessibility of long and high-quality climate series:

- For short periods (e.g. from 1960s onwards)
- Poor spatial coverage, especially over southern and south-eastern countries or
- Have not quality enough

This is hampering progress on our capability to detect, predict & adapt the countries to the impacts of climate variability & change & is limiting the timely delivery of climate products and services

Progress made since the last two years

- Besides other dissemination and coordination (e.g. ECA&D, ISTI, ISPD, ACRE, DARECLIMED) activities:
 - Updating and maintaining the MEDARE web-site for linking the MEDARE Community
 - Defining, implementing and populating the MEDARE Metadata Base (http://app.omm.urv.cat/urv) with country and research projects metadata on long and key Mediterranean Climate records: about 620 sites documented for mainly TX/TN and RR (SLP) at daily (subdaily)
 - Designing the "query" for accessing to the metadata (still password protected...)
 - Paving the way for MEDARE becoming a WMO/WIS Data Collection and Production Centre (DCPC)
 - Undertaking DARE activities over North Africa and Middle East countries under the opportunity that brought us the EU EURO4M project and in cooperation with NMHS in these areas






The MEDARE Metadata Base: easy access and users

Looking for funding opportunities...

- Submission of COST-Action proposals: the EUropean NETworking on innovative and integrated DAta REscue methods and procedures (EUNetDARE) Proposal References: oc-2011-2-10374 and oc-2012-1-12047
 - Good marks, but didn't go through
- □ Taken the idea agreed in the last MEDARE meeting of offering a DARE component in any national, regional and international research project proposal: E.g. The opportunity that brought us the EU-FP7 funded European Observations and Reanalysis for Monitoring (EURO4M) at the regional scale → rescuing/developing long records for key location in southern and south-eastern Med
- National activities (to learn from country presentations)

MEDARE current status

- Managing and updating the MEDARE Metadata Base
- Undertaking DARE activities over southern and south-eastern Mediterranean countries under the opportunity brought by EURO4M
- Other funding opportunities: the DARE-SEE project and (hopefully) a future follow-up of EURO4M
- Paving the way for MEDARE becoming a DCPC
- Starting to develop the MEDARE Climate Data Base: this meeting purpose...

MEDARE challenges

- Organizational:
 - SG rotation (later on the 2nd day)
 - How to get the 4 WGs better involved, coordinated and more actives when we are a multi-country initiative?
 - Need to get more members involved in managing MEDARE, the C3 only can't manage adequately all the potential activities
- Funding constrains:
 - MEDARE is not a regularly funded network... WMO provides funds for meetings, as well as some NMHS (e.g. AEMET for the first meeting)
 - Need for a funded networking scheme (e.g. COST proposals submissions, but not yet succeeded)
 - Need for promoting DARE components in any research proposal submitted to national, European, international and other funding opportunities
- Defining and managing the MEDARE Data base: this meeting some expectable outcome on this
- Training on DARE techniques: C3 keen on offering trainers and assistance on DARE, but need for funding
- Keeping momentum for DARE in the GMR
